### In-person at SJL and online, time/s TBD



I visited Matthew, the owner of Lucy's Flour Shop, a little while back. As I nibbled on an enormous chocolate chip cookie, I began to tell him a story.

A few years back, on a bitterly cold December evening, there was a visitation at the funeral home across the street from his bakery. The people bundled up in coats, scarves, and blankets, were lined up around the building waiting to hug the family of the deceased. Seemingly out of nowhere, a man showed up and began giving away hot coffee to the people outside. People who entered the funeral home with coffee in their hands whispered of a mysterious man handing out free coffee, and how much they appreciated it.

I looked at Matthew and said, "I have a suspicion that you were that man. Is that right?"

Matthew very humbly replied, "Yes. I felt so bad for them and wanted to do something, but all I could do was make coffee, so I made coffee."

I responded that he blessed so many people that night by helping them warm up and by showing there's good in the world. He added a positive note to a devastating situation.

I paused, then added, "That visitation was for my sixteen-year-old son. Thank you for being so kind."

That conversation has stuck in my head

since then. "All I could do was make coffee, so I made coffee.

Somedays, I am burdened with the reality that I can't do everything to help everybody. I truly do want to make a difference in people's lives and change the world. I dream big, but I can't do it all. Matthew's words came back to me recently. "All I could do was make coffee, so I made coffee." I repeatedly asked myself, "what is my 'coffee' in this situation?" I can't do everything, but I can do something, so I figured out how to do it and I did it. None of us can do it all, but we can all do something, and if we do, we can make a difference in the world. I challenge you to ask yourself often, what is my coffee?", and then go make your coffee.

# Young At Heart

Young at Heart met Tues March 20th with 9 in attendance for guest speaker Jesse Lloyd from Veterans Journey Forward at the Veterans Memorial Museum in Chehalis. Jesse served for 5 years as a Marine in Infantry and Security. He then achieved a Bachelor's degree in Psychology and has nearly completed a Master's degree in Counseling. He has expertise in Post Traumatic

Stress, Substance Abatement, and Family Counseling. Lewis County veterans can access his assistance for free at the museum and at Timberland libraries in East Lewis County which he visits once a week. He noted it is rare for veterans under age 40 to seek help for emotional issues. He is working to reach younger vets via Disc Golf, a 5K run, and other recreational activities. Veterans have only to complete 5 minutes of paperwork with VJF to receive free help. Historically, the VA in the Pacific Northwest is among the worst in the United States. Veterans Journey Forward is NOT part of the VA, is funded by a grant from Lewis County, and began here the Fall of 2022. Its Veterans Service Officer Brianna Smith secured \$600,000 in back benefits to local veterans in January 2024 alone! Any local veteran is encouraged to consult Veterans Journey Forward for any concerns .
