## **Shepherd Me, O God**

Last Sunday we sang "Shepherd me, O God, beyond my wants, beyond my fears, from death into life."\* The haunting tune of Marty Haugen's Psalm 23 has companioned me for years: on morning jogs and mountain hikes, in tense meetings and sleepless nights, at my dear friend's funeral and many Sunday services, through our move back to western Washington six years ago. Its melody shapes my prayer and soothes my soul in anxious, confusing, threatening, and ordinary times.

It welcomes the reality of a spiritual Shepherd leading me and those I love through dark valleys into light and life. It invites me to draw near and let him restore my soul.

Years ago I was jogging in a fall downpour with a praise song in my head: "Better is one day in your courts, better is one day in your house, better is one day in your courts than thousands elsewhere" (Ps. 84). Suddenly it sunk in: THIS is the house of the Lord. This road. This rain. All creation is the house of the Lord! I and every-one I love dwell in the house of the Lord forever, now and always. There is nowhere we can go to flee from God's presence (Ps. 139).

Dear friends, my hope and prayer for each of you and all of us this spring is that we meet and trust God in Christ as our Good Shepherd, who gently and firmly leads us beyond all we want and fear, from death to life. And I hope and pray that as we follow him, we each become good shepherds in our homes and communities, loving one another as Christ loves us.

And I hope that you might love and pray Haugen's tune as I do. Yes. Shepherd me, O God, beyond my wants, beyond my fears, from death into life. Please. Thank you. Amen.


## **Mobile Meals at Gospel Mission**

On April 27, Donna Moir, head cook, and Sue Reddick, first time MMM volunteer and assistant cook, prepared a brunch extravaganza of: hash browns, scrambled eggs, and assorted hot sausage/veggie combo. Jim Jahnsen prepped toast choices of white, wheat, Texas, or English muffins with assorted jelly packs or freshly mashed avocado. Other sides were cheese slices, halved bananas, assorted juices, and individual cartons of milk which Shari Blackwell had scored at 100 for \$6 at JJBerrys. Sue Edwards wrapped utensils, beat dozens of eggs, and packaged her homemade dried tart cherry (fruit provided by Shari) muffins for addition to the sack lunches. For the first time I recall since starting May 2023, we were allowed to serve guests with paper plates and plastic utensils. This greatly reduced the dishwashing to serving pans and utensils as we also served directly on paper plates without placing them on serving trays. A total of 80 plates was served, counting a small number of seconds. Guests really seemed to enjoy this hearty brunch. Our crew was finished in just under 4 hours.
